## IMPORTANT NOTICE

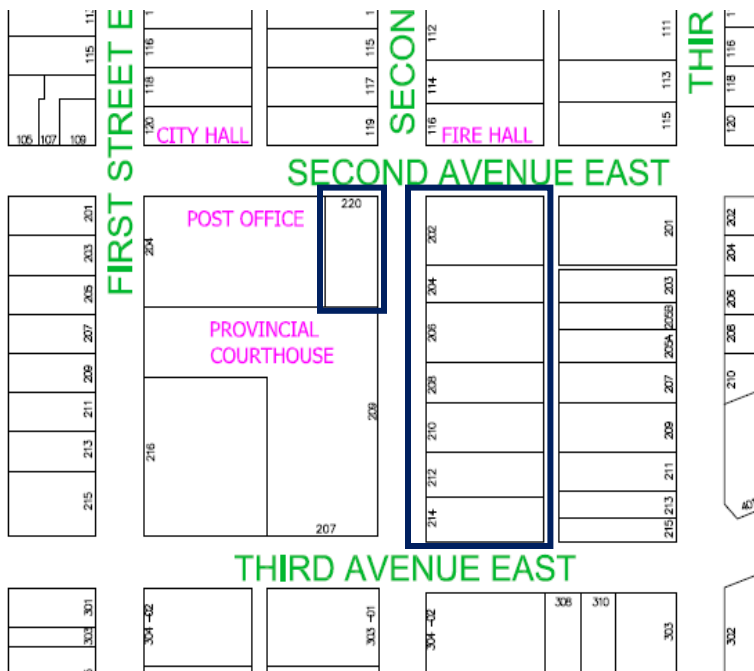
In order to complete repairs by the water tower, the City had to temporarily turn off the water to the following locations around 10:00 a.m. on Friday, January 13, 2017. If the work is completed as planned, we estimate that water services will be restored later this afternoon or early evening.

**The affected area is the residents of 202-214 2nd St East and 220 2nd Ave East.**

When the water service is restored, we advise that you open each tap in your home, one at a time, and let them run for about 20 seconds each. This should release any air trapped in your home's water lines. If the water is cloudy or contains grit, continue to run the hot and cold water taps until the water runs clear. You may need to run the hot water long enough to completely exchange the water in the hot water heater.

As is the case with all disruptions in the water system, a drinking water advisory will be in place for those same residents once the system is turned back on until the proper testing is completed (approximately 5 – 7 days). **Please see the reverse side of this notice for information regarding the advisory.**

# **DRINKING WATER ADVISORY**

**This Advisory applies to the residents of 202-214 2nd St East and 220 2nd Ave East in the City of Meadow Lake, effective Friday, January 13 at 10:00 a.m. until further notice.**

The City of Meadow Lake is conducting work or repairs on the water supply system in this area. While this work is being completed, surrounding soil or other contaminants could enter the system. Consuming unsafe water could affect your health. Therefore, a drinking water advisory will be in place until the City receives confirmation that the water is safe for consumption.

## **Please follow these instructions:**

- (a) boil all water, used for drinking purposes, for at least one (1) minute, at a rolling boil, prior to use;
- (b) boil water to be used for other activities where it may be ingested, including:
  - (i) brushing teeth or soaking false teeth;
  - (ii) washing fruits and vegetables;
  - (iii) food or drink which will not be subsequently heated; and
  - (iv) ice cubes;
- (c) not use the water for washing dishes, unless the water has been boiled or the dishes are sanitized in another fashion. Washed dishes and utensils can be soaked in a bleach water solution (approximately 2 tablespoons of bleach per gallon or 10 ml of bleach per liter of water) for at least two minutes after being washed to kill any bacteria which may be present.  
**Note: Do not mix bleach with soaps or detergents.**
- (d) not drink from any public drinking fountains supplied with water from the public water supply;
- (e) ensure that younger children and infants are sponge bathed;
- (f) use an alternative water source known to be safe, if they do not wish to boil the water; and
- (g) consult with your physician if you have cuts or rashes that are severe before using the water.

Under most circumstances, there is no need to boil water used for other household purposes. Adults, adolescents and older children may shower, bathe or wash using tap water but should avoid swallowing the water. Laundry may be washed in tap water, either by hand or by machine.

This Advisory is effective immediately, and will not be lifted until the water supply is determined to be completely safe.
